## Bridge by Phillip Alder 7-30-91

Fiscal cutbacks in the early 1970s forced two spy organizations, Control and Kaos, to cease normal operations. They agreed to continue their rivalry at the bridge table. After one hand, Kaos led by 100 points, Maxwell Smart (Agent 86) having gone two down in a "cold" three no-trump.


In deal two, the Chief (North) opened two no-trump, showing 21-22 points. Max bid his suits and then used Blackwood to learn that his partner had two aces and four kings. Showing uncharacteristic competence, Max calculated that the club queen was probably missing and that the spade suit was solid. He bid seven spades.

Siegfried, West, led the heart five.
"Think harder over this hand, Max," advised the Chief.
"OK, Chief."
"I can tell you are in danger."

## "And loving it."

Max had to find the club queen to make his contract. Leaving the key suit till last, he won the heart lead in dummy and drew trumps, discarding a heart and a club from the dummy. Max played a heart to the dummy's ace, ruffed a heart in hand and ran his three diamond tricks.

## Advancing Players Page $4^{\text {th }}$ Suit Forcing

 TOOLKITFourth－suit forcing is the popular term for the idea that a bid by responder of the only unbid suit at his second turn is an artificial force． Most play that it is forcing to game，although some play it is forcing one round only．The bid is made when responder has doubts about strain or level．

Suppose you hold：$\Delta \mathrm{K} 2 \vee \mathrm{AK} \mathrm{J} 42 \vee 103$ 3．You are South and this is the bidding：
North South
1＊1＊
1ه ？

You have enough values for game，yet no bid is suitable．You cannot bid 3NT with three low clubs．Many players agree that a jump to $3 \vee$ shows a six－card suit and is invitational．If you have that agreement，you cannot rebid $3 \boldsymbol{\downarrow}$ ．In other words，you don＇t have a convenient rebid．Playing fourth－suit forcing，you should bid $2 \boldsymbol{2}$ ，a conventional waiting bid．Partner＇s first obligation is to raise hearts with three－card support．His second obligation is to bid 2NT．You don＇t promise clubs to bid 2e－it is an artificial bid．Your partner needs a club stopper，therefore，to bid notrump．Partner can rebid his second suit to show extra length．In the sample auction， for example，2a would show six or more diamonds and at least five spades．If partner has neither heart support nor a club stopper，he should rebid his first suit $-2 \vee$ in the previous auction．

## Practice hands

Here are some examples to clarify how fourth－suit forcing works．
What do you call holding：aK 107 PAK 874 J 104 \＆2？

Answer：This one is easy — bid 2a．You want to see if your partner has three－card heart support．If not，then you will bid 3NT．

Answer：Bid 4a．Do not bid $2 \star$ ，fourth－suit forcing．You have four card spade support and values for game — bid it．
What do you call holding：AK 1072 因K 87 J10 4 四2？

Answer：Bid 3NT．Partner does not have four of either major．You have values for game and stoppers in the unbid suit．You don＇t need to bid fourth－suit forcing．It is used when you aren＇t sure where to play the contract．

## Other matters to discuss

These are related issues to discuss with your partner：
1．Fourth－suit forcing is not used if one partner is previously a passed hand．（Other agreements are possible．）
2．Fourth－suit forcing is not used after a $2 / 1$ response．It is used only when the one player bids one of a suit and the partner responds at the one level．

3．Fourth－suit forcing is not used when opponents intervene in the bidding．You can use the cuebid instead as a forcing probe．
4．A jump in the fourth suit shows a $5-5$ hand and is strongly invitational．Consider this auction：
North South
1＊ 1 －

You might hold：$\uparrow 2$ VK Q J $43 \leqslant 5$ A J 1043 ．
5．One auction merits special discussion：

In this auction，most players treat 1［as natural and forcing．A jump to $2 \boldsymbol{A}$ denies a four－card spade suit，but promises values for game．
6．Fourth－suit forcing is not used after a reverse or after a $2 \boldsymbol{o p e n e r}$ ．In these cases，you are in a forcing auction，so the artificial bid is not needed．

# Advancing Players Page <br> from Michaels Cuebid 

The Michaels cuebid - brainchild of the late Mike Michaels - allows a player to describe a two-suited hand in one bid in competitive auctions. It is typically reserved for hands with a 5-5 (or longer) pattern.

When a player bids a suit which has originally been called by the opponents, that player has made a cuebid. A Michaels cuebid is almost always used in the direct position, i.e., immediately after an opponent has made her bid. For example if your right-hand opponent opened $1 *$ and you bid $2 \&$, your $2 \&$ call would be a cuebid. Further, if you and your partner agree to play Michaels cuebids, your $2 \boldsymbol{*}$ call would have a specific meaning.

## Major Two-Suiters


If your RHO opens 1a, the Michaels cuebid allows you to describe these hands nicely. Bid 2e with either to tell your partner you have a major two-suiter. If your opponent had opened $1 \star$ instead, you would have bid $2 \star$ to give the same message.

Playing Michaels cuebids, the auctions
RHO You LHO Partner and RHO You LHO Partner
show a major two-suiter. Put another way, a direct cuebid of an opponent's opening bid of one-of-a-minor shows the majors, 5-5 or longer. Do not make this bid unless you are 5-5 in the two suits; 5-4 is not good enough to use the Michaels cue bid.

An important question, however, is how strong a hand does the Michaels cuebid promise? This is a matter of partnership style, but many expert partnerships prefer that Michaels be used to show either a weak hand (say, 6 to 11 points) or a strong hand (a good 16 or more high-card points).

Hands with intermediate strength should simply overcall at the one level, with the hope that the second suit can be shown later in the auction. Why do this? It's to give partner some indication of our strength and involve him in the decision process as to how high we compete.

## Major-minor Two-Suiters

Michaels can also be used to show certain major-minor two-suiters after an enemy $1 \checkmark$ or 1 opening. The auctions
RHO You LHO Partner and RHO You LHO Partner

show five or more cards in the other major and an unspecified five-card minor. The strength requirements are the same as for minor-suit cuebids.

This tells partner you have five spades and a five-card minor. What if partner doesn't have a fit for spades and wants to know what your minor is? He bids 2NT (conventional) to say, "Bid your minor." You can then bid $3 \uparrow$.

## Important point: Don't tell your story twice

 What now?

When you bid $2 \star$, you told partner that your hand was $5-5$ in the majors and that you had a limited hand ( 6 to 11 points) or a very good hand (16plus points). Since you have the weaker range, and partner has already chosen the suit and level he prefers, you should pass. Partner already knows what you have - don't compete to 3 ! Partner might have been forced to bid 2 A with a hand such as 107 8 6876 K 10932 .

He won't like your 3abid (and you won't like the result).
Let's change your hand to this: $\uparrow \mathrm{AKQ4} 4 \vee \mathrm{AKJ} 62$ - 7 .
After a 1 opening by RHO, you bid $2 \uparrow$. LHO passes and partner bids 2 . RHO bids $3 \boldsymbol{*}$. Should you bid again? Yes. This time you have a very good hand and could make game if partner has as little as $\mathrm{Q}-\mathrm{x}-\mathrm{x}$ in hearts. Many players would simply jump to $4 \boldsymbol{\mathrm { V }}$. Remember, however, that
 this hand could easily produce a major-suit game opposite mild support from partner. After this auction

bid 4a. With this 6-6 freak, high-card points are irrelevant. Just bid the game. The opponents may well bid more, but the point is that you should bid again after the Michaels cuebid when your distribution is wild or when you have a very strong hand.

Early in 1970, Control and Kaos, those well-known spy organizations, had to forgo operations after financial cutbacks. Instead of spying, they continued their fight --goodness and niceness vs. evil-- at the bridge table.

The first rubber began well for Control. Maxwell Smart, Agent 86, brought home a grand slam on deal two. Kaos had a chance to recover ground on hand three, Shtarker becoming the declarer in four hearts after a straightforward auction (The positions have been shifted so declarer can be South.)

Max, West, led the spade queen. Shtarker won in hand and detached a low heart, but then he spotted the problem. If he led a trump immediately, the defense would win that trick and lead another spade. Then when he lost the lead in either minor, they would be able to cash a spade trick. Instead he led the club three, Max signaling with the two and dummy playing the queen.

The Chief paused to consider his play. It looked right to win with the ace and return a spade, but perhaps Shtarker had K-J-3 of clubs. In that case he would get a spade discard. Assessing the situation correctly, the Chief played the club four.

Shtarker led another club, but the Chief won with the ace and returned a spade to dummy's king. Shtarker called for the heart jack, but the Chief put up his ace and led a third spade. Max won that trick and cashed the diamond ace to defeat the game.
"You idiot, Shtarker," cried Siegfried. "Eef only you vin zee first trick in zee dummy, you haf an entry to your hand viz zee spade ace to pitch your loser on zee zird club."

## Bridge by Phillip Alder 1-13-92



After fiscal cuts in 1970 stopped the spying activities of Control and Kaos, those two rival TV-sitcom agencies turned to bridge. After four rubbers, Control led by 10 points. For the fifth rubber, Control was represented by Maxwell Smart (Agent 86) and the Chief. Kaos fielded Simon the Likable and Siegfried, the German assassin.
"Simon the Likable," explained the Chief to Max, "is the most ruthless, cunning, evil and treacherous Kaos agent in the entire world -- and a heck of a nice guy."

Simon smiled; it was impossible to dislike him.
On the first deal, Smart overlooked an important defensive play. After a limit raise by Siegfried, Simon the Likable was in four hearts. The Chief led the club king, under which Max signaled encouragement with the nine.

Now the Chief had a problem. Was the nine from a doubleton? If so, he should continue with the ace and another club, giving Max a ruff. That would be the only defense if declarer had 3-5-1-4 distribution. However, if Max had the club queen, the Chief should underlead his club ace at trick two. Then Max could switch to a diamond, in hope of giving the defenders four minor-suit tricks.

Simon smiled at the Chief. The Chief continued with the ace and another club. Simon ruffed, drew trumps and discarded two of his diamonds on dummy's spades to make his game.
"Max, why didn't you play the club queen at trick one, promising the jack or a singleton? Then it's easy for me to lead a low club at trick two."
"Sorry, Chief."
Simon the Likable smiled.
