Bridge by Phillip Alder 7-31-91


Early in 1970, Control and Kaos, those well-known spy organizations, had to forgo operations after financial cutbacks. Instead of spying, they continued their fight --goodness and niceness vs. evil-- at the bridge table.

The first rubber began well for Control. Maxwell Smart, Agent 86, brought home a grand slam on deal two.
Kaos had a chance to recover ground on hand three, Shtarker becoming the declarer in four hearts after a straightforward auction (The positions have been shifted so declarer can be South.) Max, West, led the spade queen. Shtarker won in hand and detached a low heart, but then he spotted the problem. If he led a trump immediately, the defense would win that trick and lead another spade. Then when he lost the lead in either minor, they would be able to cash a spade trick. Instead he led the club three, Max signaling with the two and dummy playing the queen.
The Chief paused to consider his play. It looked right to win with the ace and return a spade, but perhaps Shtarker had K-J-3 of clubs. In that case he would get a spade discard. Assessing the situation correctly, the Chief played the club four.
Shtarker led another club, but the Chief won with the ace and returned a spade to dummy's king. Shtarker called for the heart jack, but the Chief put up his ace and led a third spade. Max won that trick and cashed the diamond ace to defeat the game.
"You idiot, Shtarker," cried Siegrried. "Eef only you vin zee first trick in zee dummy, you haf an entry to your hand viz zee spade ace to pitch your loser on zee zird club."

Let's not use that " $\mathbf{C}$ " word. A less threatening term is "unethical." This won't make me popular with everyone out there, but let me put it right out there on the table: "It is UNETHICAL to take advantage of your partner's tempo." If you have heard otherwise, or are confused, this article is for you.


#### Abstract

I know, I know. Some of you are thinking, "These nasty complainers are ruining our game. You know-the ones that call the director every time I take time to think." Yes, I know. I don't approve of litigiously "calling the cops" after any tempo break. Especially in a "social/fun" game, and certainly against new players, there is no need to scream for a director over every tempo violation. I feel your pain! But, let's not lose sight of the lesson when playing in a duplicate game or tournament.

Maybe your eyes normally glaze over when reading about this topic, but I can explain it in easy-to-follow English. When your partner takes 75 seconds to pass, you are not entitled to know that he has a problem. It is your ethical duty (obligation!) to not take advantage. If you have a marginal action, you must bend over backwards (break a few bones doing so) to do what is counter-indicated.


Example
auctions:

Your partner took 75 seconds. You know he was thinking of bidding. You know he isn't broke. He doesn't have a flat 4-count. If he had "nothing," it would not have taken him 75 seconds to pass. You have unauthorized information from the amount of time it took him to pass. If you have a marginal balancing decision, you must not take advantage. Unless you are absolutely sure it is normal to take action, you should pass. This is the proper approach. It is the right thing. You'll feel proud of yourself. The opponents will respect you. You can die in peace. If instead, you violate the code of honor, you will incur the wrath of your opponents (and maybe a higher source). Expect a director and maybe a committee (ugh!). Don't bid, say, 3 with only 11 points and a so-so 5 -card spade suit. If you have 17 points (or any other obvious hand), then you can make the indicated bid, of course.

Your partner opened 1 then took 48 seconds to bid $2 \boldsymbol{\sim}$. What do your psychic powers tell you? Surely he has spades and hearts. What strength? He has extra values, of course. He was thinking of bidding more than $2 \boldsymbol{\top}$. With a minimum, he'd have bid $2 \boldsymbol{*}$ in tempo. If you are considering making a marginal invitation now, don't do it! Just pass or bid 2 and take your medicine.

Did I mince any words? Is this not $100 \%$ clear to everyone? Read carefully: It is okay to huddle. Sometimes you have a problem. If you do take 64 seconds to pass, so be it. You did nothing wrong. It is your partner who has to uphold the spirit of the game. As long as he doesn't take advantage, all is well and good in the world. If you are at all confused about this (I know it is a tricky topic for inexperienced players), please send Larry Cohen an e-mail and ask away.

## Notes:

1) I repeat-this is not for beginners. We don't want to scare them away. We do, however, wish to educate them. If there is a nice way to explain this issue, I'm all for it. That's why I wrote this article.
2) This is also not for "social" or casual players. (But, I wish I could explain it to them, as well). At any level, I suspect that most players, at least subconsciously, are aware when they take advantage of partner's tempo.
3) I didn't want to overwhelm you, but there are also issues of tempo on defense! If your partner thinks a long time before ducking his ace, you are not entitled to know he has that ace. Be aware. As usual, you can take all the time you want on a trick. Just don't "read anything" into partner's slow plays.
4) l've discussed only slow actions. Don't fall into the trap of "fast passing." When the opponents skip the bidding, don't pass in 0.02 seconds to convey to your partner that you are broke. Furthermore, if you open a dead minimum hand, and the competitive auction comes back to you, please don't pull out your pass card while RHO is still placing his bidding card on the table. Such an action is at best unethical. At worst-well, I said I won't use that " $C$ " word.

Let's use this one instead: Ciao.

## AdVANCING Players Page DOPI, ROPI and DEPO

While they may sound like the names of some of the Seven Dwarves, DOPI, ROPI and DEPO are actually conventional treatments designed to combat interference with Blackwood sequences.

DOPI and ROPI are better when the opponents' suit is lower-ranking than yours, while DEPO is better when their suit is higherranking.

Some examples will help. Say the auction goes like this, with your side vulnerable:

| You LHO Partner RHO |  |  |
| :--- | :--- | :--- |
| 1 S | 3 C | 4 NT |

${ }^{(1)}$ Preemptive $\quad$ (2) Blackwood or Roman Key Card Blackwood.

The opponents are being pests, either sacrificing in clubs and/or just trying to screw up your auction. How do you combat this? Since their suit (clubs) is lower-ranking than your suit (spades), DOPI is in effect. This means you double with zero aces (playing regular Blackwood) or zero key cards (playing RKCB) - that's what the 'DO' part of DOPI means. With one (1) ace/key card you pass, which is what the 'Pl' part refers to. To show more aces, bid the next suit available. 5D, therefore, would show two aces if playing regular Blackwood or two aces without the Spade Q if you're playing RKCB.

In this example, both sides are vulnerable:
You LHO Partner RHO
?
This is similar to the first auction, but here right-hand opponent doubles 4NT instead of bidding 5C. Some pairs play this way to tell their partners they want to sacrifice or that they want partner to lead his suit (clubs) without actually bidding it - usually because they're vulnerable and they're scared of being doubled.

Since you might just ignore this double and give the regular Blackwood response, it doesn't cost them anything to play this way. You can try to stick it to them, however, by using ROPI. Redouble shows zero aces ('RO'); if partner decides not to bid a slam after finding out you have zero aces, he might instead decide to take his chances in 4NT redoubled! He could, after all, have the ace of their suit or the protected king or even a tenace such as the ace-queen. The opponents might run to 5 C which gives you the opportunity to double. Either way, you may well score better trying to nail the opposition.

The same is true if you pass to show one ace/key card ('Pl'). At matchpoints especially, you might decide to go for the top in 4NT (by your side) doubled or 5C (by them) doubled.

What if their suit is higher than yours? Say the auction is this, with your side vulnerable:

| You | LHO | Partner | RHO |
| :--- | :--- | :--- | :--- | :--- |
| $1 D$ | $2 S$ | $4 N T$ | $5 S$ |

Since their suit is higher-ranking, DEPO is better. Double shows an even number of aces ('DE'), pass shows an odd number ('PO'). If you didn't play DEPO, you would either be forced to guess whether to bid a slam which might not make or to double them when slam is cold. By doubling or passing, you get to stay on the five level, tell your partner how many aces you have and preserve the option of either bidding a slam or smacking the opponents.

Although the opportunity to use these treatments is rare, checking these boxes on your convention card may dissuade your opponents from interfering in your ace-asking auctions.

## What if we play 1430 ?

Some pairs prefer a variation of Roman Key Card Blackwood in which the 5 Clubs response shows one or four key cards and the 5 Diamonds response shows zero or three. Pairs who play this way may prefer to play DIPO (double with one ace, pass with zero) and RIPO instead of DOPI and ROPI in order to keep their responses consistent.

## Alertable?

Do not Alert DOPI, ROPI or DEPO calls during the auction. In fact, most conventional calls in an aceasking sequence are not Alertable. The reason is that it can pass unauthorized information to the Alerting side, "waking up" a player who has forgotten that they have agreed to play DOPI, ROPI or DEPO.

After the auction is over, you should explain the meanings of your calls to the opponents before the opening lead is made IF (big if!) your side declares just as you would for any ace-asking sequence.

DAILY BRIDGE TIPS
Do not lead a singleton vs. a voluntarily bid small slam if you have an ace. Partner can't have the ace and you will probably be helping declarer no end by placing the missing honors in partner's hand. On the other hand, a singleton lead against a small slam when you don't have an ace has a much better chance of succeeding. With a little luck partner will have the ace of your singleton suit or the ace of trumps.

As declarer when leading a suit that has equal honors, lead the higher or the highest if you want it covered, lead the second highest if you don't want it covered. It works like a charm.

If partner is marked with a singleton trump, there is no point in leading a trump from Kxx because neither of you will be able to continue the suit. Try another lead and hope that partner will find the trump switch, if necessary.

Keep your singletons and doubletons in the middle of your hand. Some players watch where your cards come from

> You cannot expect your partner to defend properly if you make faces or show other signs of disapproval. Not to mention that it is highly unethical.
