## An Eric Rodwell Famous Hand

This deal occurred in the final of the 1992 World Team Olympiad, which saw France defeat the United States in a 96-deal match. Neither side gained on the deal, but Eric Rodwell of the United States was sorely tested when the French found the best defense against his 4 H contract. The game was reached after Jeff Meckstroth, North, had opened the bidding with one diamond, showing fewer than 16 HCPs.


West, Paul Chemla, led his singleton club, and Rodwell took East's ten with the ace. Declarer carefully led the six of hearts, covered by the queen and ace. Dummy's jack of hearts was then led, and Rodwell deposited the eight on the jack as West won with the king. Chemla returned a spade to East's ace, ruffed the club return with the seven and then exited with a diamond in this position:


It was at this point that Rodwell's advance planning paid off. Had he not preserved the heart deuce in his hand, he would have had no choice but to play low from dummy on the diamond return, and when East produced the king, the contract would have gone down one.
As it was though, Rodwell was now able to put up dummy's diamond ace and lead a club to the king, unblocking the suit. The heart deuce was then led to dummy's four, and the club queen was cashed, Rodwell discarding the diamond queen to make his game.

At the other table, the French declarer had no problem making the same contract after the U.S. West led a spade to his partner's ace at trick one.

History of Cheating in Bridge - Part 4 of 4

bWe'll take a rest for now from Ethics.

There were some "cheating episodes" pre-1965, but I wish to start my exploration in that year with a "Story of an Accusation." That is the title of the book written by Terence Reese, claiming his innocence. [Reese, perhaps the best bridge write in history, published this book in niw own defense. It had been unavailable for many years and there is now an updated edition available.] Taking the other side, was Alan Truscott in "The Great Bridge Scandal." [Now, almost fifty years later, the true inside story can be told - the investigation, the accusation, and the very different results of the World Bridge Federation and British Bridge League inquiries.]

This all took place in the World Championships in Buenos Aries. Did they cheat? After reading both books, I was more convinced by the latter. It seems that Reese and partner Boris Schapiro were signaling illegal information. Based on how many fingers they held behind their fanned cards, they were potentially passing information about the heart suit.

This is a "conclusion" from Wikipedia: In May 2005, the English journalist David Rex-Taylor, a bridge player and publisher, claimed that Reese had made a confession to him forty years earlier, one that was not to be revealed until 2005 and after he and Schapiro were dead. The purported confession claimed that Reese and Schapiro were indeed signaling, but only to show that such signaling was possible b(and so were not actually paying attention to each other's signals), purportedly as part of a book on cheating (which was abandoned after the scandal broke). Although this explanation could conceivably reconcile the use of finger signals with the absence of evidence from bidding or play, there is no corroborating evidence to support this account. In contrast, Shapiro's widow claims he continued to deny the accusations to his death.

Then we have two cases from the 1970's. At the Bermuda Bowl in 1975, journalist Bruce Keidan noticed some fancy footwork at the table. The fairly new screens (to prevent partners from seeing each other) didn't go all the way to the floor. Italians Gianfranco Facchini and Sergio Zucchelli were touching each other's shoes under the table in an apparent attempt to relay information. They went on to be known as the "foot soldiers" (humorously also called "the vegetables") and were never heard from much after this event. Now the screens go all the way to the floor.

In 1976, there was a scandal that hit home for me. I was 17 years old and idolized my namesake. A famous Larry Cohen had been winning everything. I had just started attending bridge tournaments and in the hotel, I would often get phone messages intended for him. Before I ever got to meet him in person, I found out about cheating accusations during the 1976 U.S. team trials in Houston. Apparently, he and his partner, Dr. Richard Katz, were sending information by sniffs and coughs. There was never concrete proof, but the consensus opinion is that something nefarious was going on. Lawsuits were filed, but ultimately in 1982 the players were readmitted to ACBL but had to agree to never play together again (at least not until 1984 when they could submit an application request).

This went on to be known as the "Houston Affarr" and it has haunted me ever since. History has a way of blurring time and facts. Many people read about the case and have no idea that the Larry Cohen indicted is not me. Edgar Kaplan once tried to differentiate us in match reports by referring to the "other" Larry Cohen as the "wicked Larry Cohen." I've actually met the other Larry Cohen (and played against him) several times and he seems to be a very nice guy. Maybe we can just use middle initials. He is "Larry T. Cohen." I am "Larry $\mathbf{N}$. Cohen." No matter what I do, confusion and suspicion will always follow me.

History of Cheating in Bridge - Part 4 of 4

In 1979, my team (I was in college) finished 3rd in a major team game. I was thrilled. The winning team contained a pair named SionCokin. Subsequently, they were found guilty of cheating. I am still hoping we get moved up to 2nd place.
They were supposedly putting their score pencil in strange positions to indicate the suit they wanted led (this was before screens were used at all National championships). They were caught on film and their code was broken. They were barred from ACBL for 5 years (and from playing as partners for life).
Starting in 1980, there were several decades where nothing major happened. There were some minor cheating cases (worldwide), but nothing like the headline-grabbing cases of the 1960's and 1970's.

The early 21st century was quiet as far as major cases go. However, there were "whispers" about some prominent pairs. In 2015 several of those pairs were caught.

During the past decade, more and more top-level matches have been videotaped. This, along with recording of every bid and play (during live internet broadcasts) provided a ton of information. Several prominent bridge player/analysts (led by Norway's Boye Borgeland) were instrumental in "breaking the code."

The \#1 ranked pair in the world, Fantoni-Nunes were sending information by the way they played their cards on defense. A card placed vertically meant one thing. A card placed horizontally meant another. All the details are summarized nicely in this video by Michael Clark: https://youtu.be/TKe7gLTfaF8

Another highly ranked pair, Fisher-Schwartz were sending information to their partner to help with the opening lead. The player who took the bidding tray off the table was putting the board back in a place to indicate which suit he wanted led. Another Micahel Clark video was prepared which nicely illustrates this illicit scheme:

Aside from these two major cases, a top German and Polish pair were accused (one pair confessing) of cheating. Several mainstream publications published featured articles on the case (as below).

While it is very disturbing to see these things taking place, there is a bit of a sensational/gossipy side to it. For better or worse, it did put bridge into the mainstream news.

While it hurts to know how many titles were stolen by this unthinkable partnership cheating, it is good to know that these pairs will never be allowed to play together again. Furthermore, procedures are in place to prevent further cases from occurring in the future.
