## Famous Hands: Jeff Meckstroth

This deal from the United States-Great Britain match of the 1991 World Team Championship brought together two pairs noted for their aggressive bidding systems.


North-South were Eric Rodwell and Jeff Meckstroth of the United States, pitted against Britain's Tony Forrester and Andy Robson. Both pairs lived up to their advance billing as the auction unfolded. Robson began by opening an off-shape 1NT (12-14 points in the partnership style). When this rolled around to Meckstroth, he bid $2 \%$ for takeout. Robson then showed his true colors by leaping to three diamonds. This did not silence Rodwell, who cuebid diamonds to ask his partner to choose a major suit and Meckstroth's four heart bid ended the auction.
Robson led the ace and another diamond, declarer discarding a spade on the king. Meckstroth was then confronted by the problem of how to tackle the trump suit. With little knowledge of the location of the missing honor cards, Meckstroth decided to delay playing trumps until he could learn a little more about the opponent's holding in the other suits. So at trick three he led a spade to the jack and was gratified to see this force the ace.
Declarer won West's spade return with the king and reviewed what he had learned up to this point- West had to have six diamonds for his three diamond bid, so he could not hold more than three clubs (more than three clubs would give him a singleton - not consistent with his original NT opening bid). So Meckstroth next played the A-K and another club, ruffing the third round in dummy without fear of being overruffed by East.
Declarer was now ready to tackle the trump suit. Since West had already shown up with the ace of spades, $\because \mathrm{Q}$ and a strong diamond suit headed by the ace, he could not hold the heart king. So
Meckstroth, played the A and another , and when East produced the $K$, the game was home.

## INTERMEDIATE/NOVICE PLAYERS PAGE

Tell, Don't Ask

Silence is golden. Here are 3 situations to examine. If you are on the "wrong" side of these, here is your big chance to change your ways.
The sign of an inexperienced player is the frivolous asking for explanations. If your opponents alert, that doesn't mean you have to do anything. After the auction is over, ask away. But, while the bidding is still underway, don't ask unless the information is vital to you.

On many auctions, you and your partner are passing throughout. Your opponents are on their way to game, maybe slam. They are alerting away. Why ask? All you accomplish by asking is to help them. They get to explain their bids, thereby clarifying matters for their partners. Too often, I've seen situations such as:
$\begin{array}{ll}\text { OPENER } & \text { RESPONDER } \\ 1 \text { Spade } & 2 \text { Diamonds }\end{array}$
2 NT 4 Clubs*

Four clubs is alerted by the opponents. You are next to bid, and you hold:

$$
\text { SQJ } 32 \text { H542 DQ64 C } 952
$$

Why should you possibly care what four clubs means? Just sit there and ignore the alert. If you ask, the opponents will verbalize (thereby helping to avoid misunderstanding) if it is Gerber, a Splinter, Natural, or something else. Wait until the auction is over. At that point, you can get all the explanations you wish.

Why do people ask when they don't care? Maybe to show off that they are paying attention? Maybe to look sophisticated. Just the opposite. It is the sure sign of inexperience to ask questions when there is no need to.

If you are on the other side of the equation (you and your partner are doing the alerting), then you are required to explain. Only if you are asked, tell.

Another pet peeve of mine (and another sure sign of inexperience) is as follows:

| YOU | OPPONENT | PARTNER | OPPONENT |
| :--- | :---: | :---: | :---: |
| 2 H | Double | Pass | 3 H |

Double!
You open a preempt, and later the opponents cue-bid your suit. This is a good time for the "silence is golden" principle. Too often, people foolishly double these cue-bids. Sometimes they even laugh and ask if it is their lead. Such doubles can only help the opponents. Trust me, they aren't playing in three hearts doubled. By doubling, you give them flexibility. They can pass the double back around to their partner. They can redouble to show a control. You give them all sorts of options they didn't have if you had just sat there and passed three hearts. Your partner knows you have hearts--why double?

Lastly, here's one l've seen many times before. Dealer opens 1D; the next player is sitting there with: S K 3 2 H A 2 DAQ108 752 C 2
Wow! What a strange hand to hold when RHO opens 1D. Any experienced player would pass in tempo. What else can you do? Presumably 2D would be a Michaels bid for the majors, and 3D would be preemptive. So, you pass and await developments (if you overcall in diamonds on the next round, it will be natural).

What do the inexperienced players do? They ask, "What does 1D show?" Or, "How many diamonds does 1?Dpromise?" Or, they sit there with an amused grin on their faces. These players obviously shouldn't try Poker, but they also need to recognize the situation so that next time they play bridge, they can pass smoothly without giving away the show.

Make sure you are aware of the 3 situations described here, so that you can be thought of as an expert. Or, at least, you won't be thought of as a neophyte. I am reminded of the famous quote: "Better to keep your mouth closed and be thought a fool than to open it and remove all doubt."

## What is the best way to teach somebody how to play bridge?

Ideally, you teach someone along with a few other people that already know how to play. It is much easier to teach in a game setting than in the abstract. It is helpful if the novice has played spades or hearts. The play of the hand is similar and includes the concept of trump.

Generally, the best way to teach is by following the order of the game itself.

1) Teach the bidding first. It begins by valuing the point count of the hand, and learning opening bids, then responses.
> 2) Deal open hands and quiz the novice on bidding through the Socratic method.
$>$ 3) Then deal some closed hands and play so the novice can experience the consequences of her actions. After each trick, keep the cards on the side of the player who played it, as in duplicate bridge, and discuss the hand later.

It is very common to kibitz (look over the shoulder of a player) during a game. This is standard and acceptable, not just for novices. Often during party bridge, the dummy (non-playing partner of the player that has won the auction) will walk around and kibitz during her partner's play.

Bridge is a social game. Personally, It is fine to play with total novices who want to learn and respect the protocol. Be sure to share some simple bridge etiquette to follow to ensure novices are not thrown out of a bridge party!

From the learner's perspective, one of the best bridge books is Alfred Sheinwold's Five Weeks to Winning Bridge.

## Intermediate/Novice Players Page

## What Should We Play?

I will give my advice on what conventions are important, and which are not. My opinions reflect 25 years of writing and teaching and are aimed at the intermediate level. This is not for beginners and not for National Champions. Anyone in between hopefully will benefit from my thoughts.

I am a staunch advocate of "less is more." My observation is that at every level of the game, players are using too many conventions. Too often I see players (from beginner to world champion) misusing or forgetting their methods, or not learning the complete convention,

Everyone would benefit if they would just KISS. (Keep It Simple, Stupid). I believe the focus on declarer play and defense is much more important than adding fancy conventions. If a convention is hard to memorize I will not endorse it. If it is highly artificial, I will say NO. If it doesn't come up much, it shouldn't be in your arsenal.

The only conventions I will endorse, must meet all three of these requirements:

1. Not highly artificial
2. Easy to remember and play
3. Comes up frequently

If I had to choose just 4 conventions, this would be my A list:

1. Negative Doubles
2. Blackwood
3. Stayman
4. Jacoby transfers

If you forced me to choose 4 more, this would be the next group, my B list:
5. 4th Suit Game Force
6. Methods (I prefer "DONT") vs. Opponents' Notrump
7. Weak jumps in competition
8. 2NT ask (Feature) after our Weak 2-bids

If you insisted I fill my convention card with 12 conventions, these would be the next four, my $\mathbf{C}$ list:
9. Unusual notrump / Michaels bids
10. New Minor Forcing
11. Jacoby 2NT
12. Support Doubles

And, since people just love to learn/play/teach conventions, these would be my D-list:
13. Lebensohl
14. Drury
15. Inverted Minors
16. Splinter Bids

Honestly, I think it would be counterproductive for $99 \%$ of players to go any further than this. The memory strain is not worth it. Someone once said, "The Rod to Hell is Paved with Good Conventions."


No spades, partner?
Hearts are trump and West, on opening lead, leads a low diamond. East, holding no diamonds, plays a spade thinking spades are trump. Later when West gets in again, he leads another diamond and this time East trumps with a heart. West says: "No spades, partner?"
