



TOP 5 BRIDGE MONSTER MYTHS ... DEBUNKED



Part 2 of 5: ALWAYS lead fourth from your longest and strongest!"

No, this is a guideline, not a rule. The Hat Lady would say there is only one rule in bridge and that is, "Always accept a breath mint from your partner." Everything else is a suggestion. Your opening lead should depend upon your defensive plan. You do have a defense plan, don't you?

All opening leads are blind, but none of them should be deaf.

- Did your partner bid? Leading partner's suit will at least let you win the post-mortem!
- Did the opponents bid a suit? It is generally not a good think to lead a suit bid by the opponents. Exception: If you have K-Q-J-10-9 of their bid suit, you probably should lead it since you OWN the suit, and they don't.
- Make it a routine practice: always stop and estimate partner's point count using the auction as a guide. For instance, if the opponents are in 3NT you assume thy have about 26 points. You have 12 points, so how many points can your partner have? Add them up! You can account for approximately 38 of the 40 points in the deck part is broke a Queen or 2 Jacks, at best! Underlead any of your honors, your fourth best, will only benefit the opponents. Find a safe passive lead instead.
- If you do decide to lead your "longest and strongest suit," remember that sequence leads always take precedence over "fourth best" leads with K-Q-J-7-2, lead the King, not the seven. From, K-Q-J-10-2, lead the King. Always lead the TOP of a sequence or broken sequence (like from K-Q-10-8-4, lead the K). Leading top of a sequence is aggressive and even safer than "fourth best" leads.

So when do you lead fourth best? When it feels right and nothing else better occurs to you! Don't use well-known platitudes as a substitute for actually thinking! Then the worst your partner can say is, "Oh, no! S/he's thinking again!"

Many new players are still leading *unsupported* aces. Unless you have the king to go with that ace, *do not lead the ace*. Save it until some big glitzy king or queen pops up from declarer or dummy that you can capture. Make your aces do some of the hard work! *More tomorrow...*

Solution to Tuesday's Hand of the Day

You have 9 top tricks and it would be routine to establish two more in the club suit for 11. A closer look reveals that East must protect both red suits, so in the ending he will be squeezed for a 12th trick. Well, maybe.

The problem is that West can duck the third club, forcing you to use a diamond entry; then, when West wins his club trick, a second diamond lead will remove a critical entry and kill the squeeze. Try it.

To succeed, you must keep control in both black suits. Win the opening lead, cash the & A and lead the *ten* of clubs! If West takes this, the squeeze will function easily, so assume he ducks. Now lead the *ten* of spades! Once again, West must duck to break up the squeeze. You now have an extra trick in spades, so just cash the & K, cross to dummy and establish the clubs to ensure your contract.

It's not the handling of difficult hands that makes the winning player. There aren't enough of them. It's the ability to avoid messing up the easy ones.
